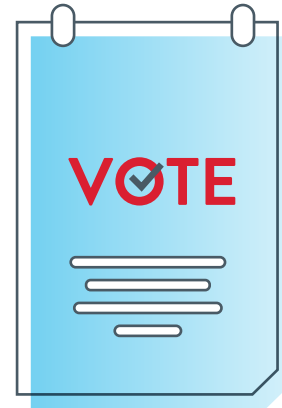

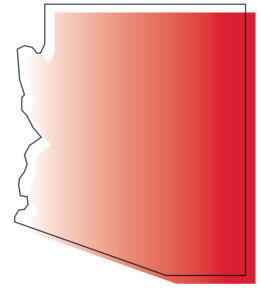
Remember, every vote counts and is an opportunity for bankers to make their voices heard!

Posters and Flyers

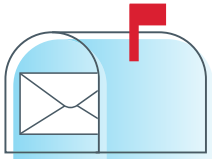

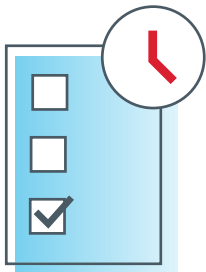

Vote by Mail

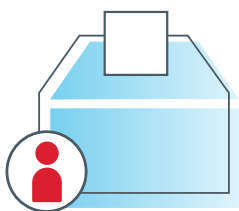


The last day to request a ballot-by-mail is July 22 for the primary and Oct. 18 for the general election. Your completed ballot-by-mail must be received by county election officials by 7:00 p.m. on Election Day. Find information on how to request a vote-by-mail ballot at the Arizona Secretary of State's website, azsos.gov/elections/voting-election.



Vote Early in Person

Each county has different in-person early voting options. In most counties you can early in-person vote between July 6 and July 29 for the primary and Oct 12 and Nov. 4 for the general election. Check your County Recorder's website, azsos.gov/county-election-info, for information on early voting sites and schedules in your county.

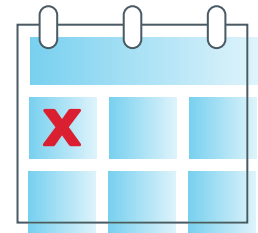


Vote in Person

Vote in person on Aug. 2 for the primary and Nov. 8 for the general election. You can cast your vote between 6 a.m. and 7 p.m. at your polling place. Check the Arizona Secretary of State's website, azsos.gov/elections/voting-election for information about voting requirements.

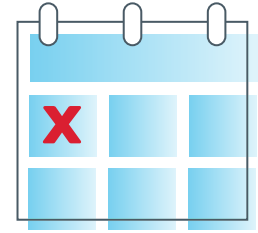

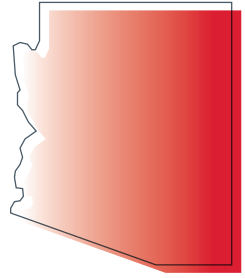

Vote by Mail

The last day to request a ballot-by-mail is July 22 for the primary and Oct. 18 for the general election. Your completed ballot-by-mail must be received by county election officials by 7:00 p.m. on Election Day. Find information on how to request a vote-by-mail ballot at the Arizona Secretary of State's website, azsos.gov/elections/voting-election.

Vote Early in Person

Each county has different in-person early voting options. In most counties you can early in-person vote between July 6 and July 29 for the primary and Oct 12 and Nov. 4 for the general election. Check your County Recorder's website, azsos.gov/county-election-info, for information on early voting sites and schedules in your county.

Vote in Person

Vote in person on Aug. 2 for the primary and Nov. 8 for the general election. You can cast your vote between 6 a.m. and 7 p.m. at your polling place. Check the Arizona Secretary of State's website, azsos.gov/elections/voting-election for information about voting requirements.

Templates

You may use your bank's internal communications tools, e.g. intranet, email, or staff meetings to encourage staff to participate in upcoming elections. Any communication to staff should include nonpartisan information that will help them to vote. You may include polling hours and location information, voter information website, and election date reminders and deadlines.

To help you get started, use the template below to help motivate, remind and provide timely information about upcoming elections to your employees.

Sample Email GOTV Message from CEO:
